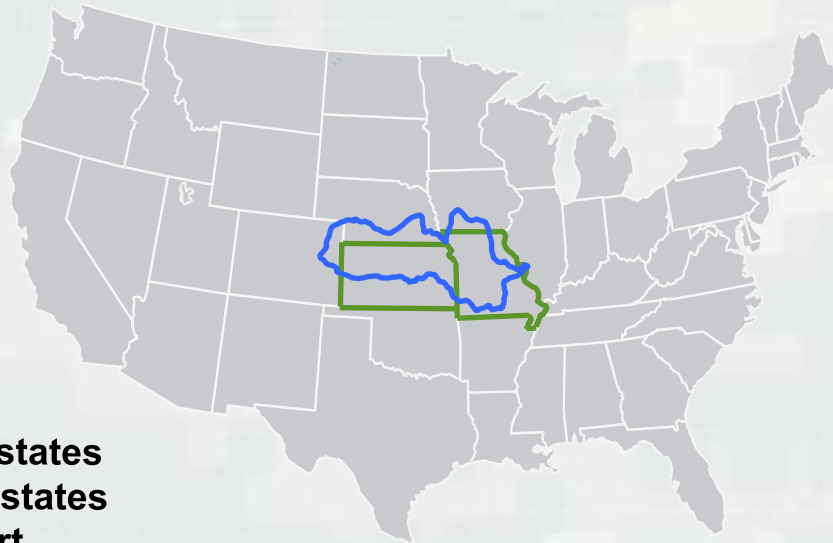

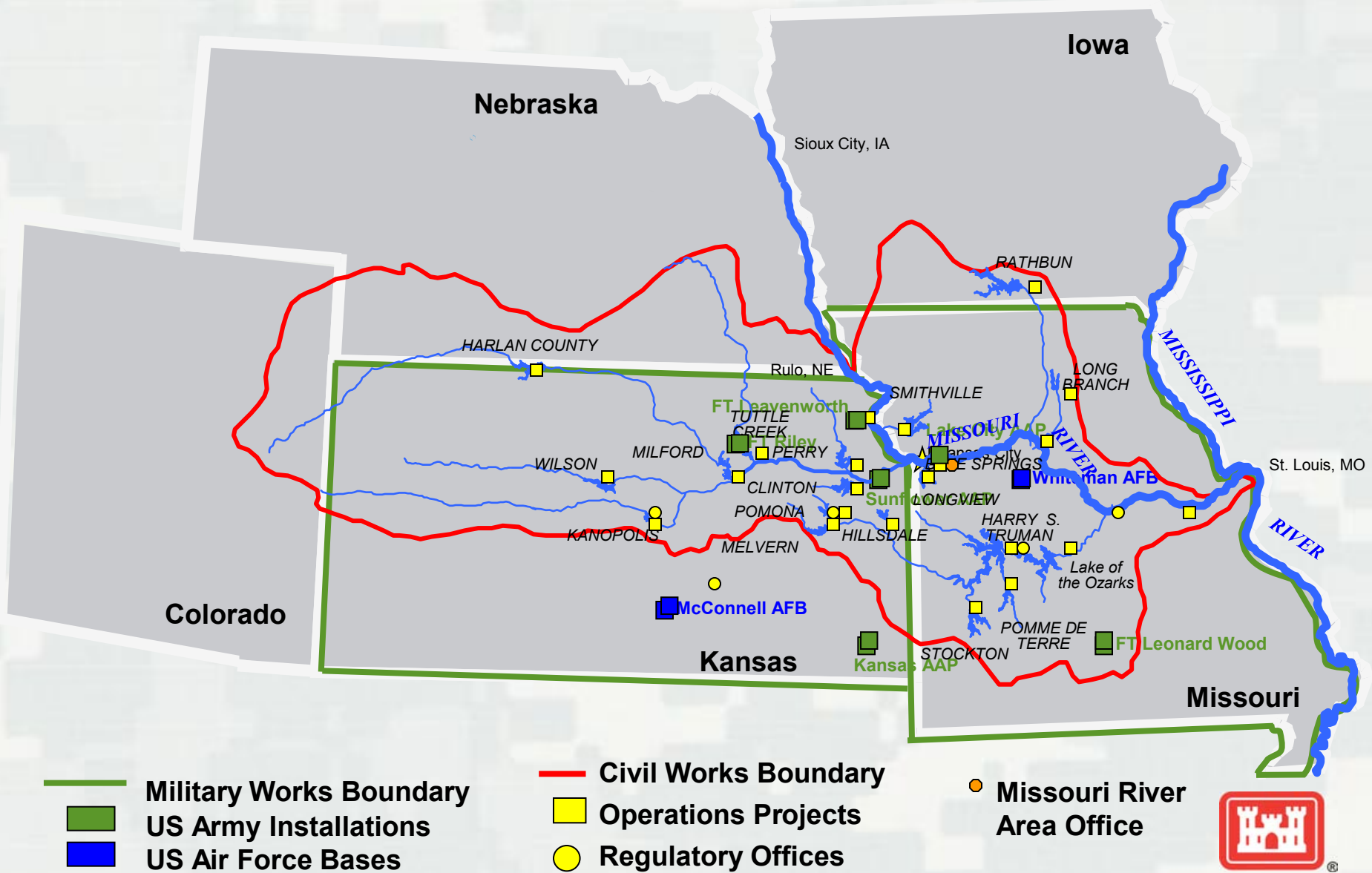

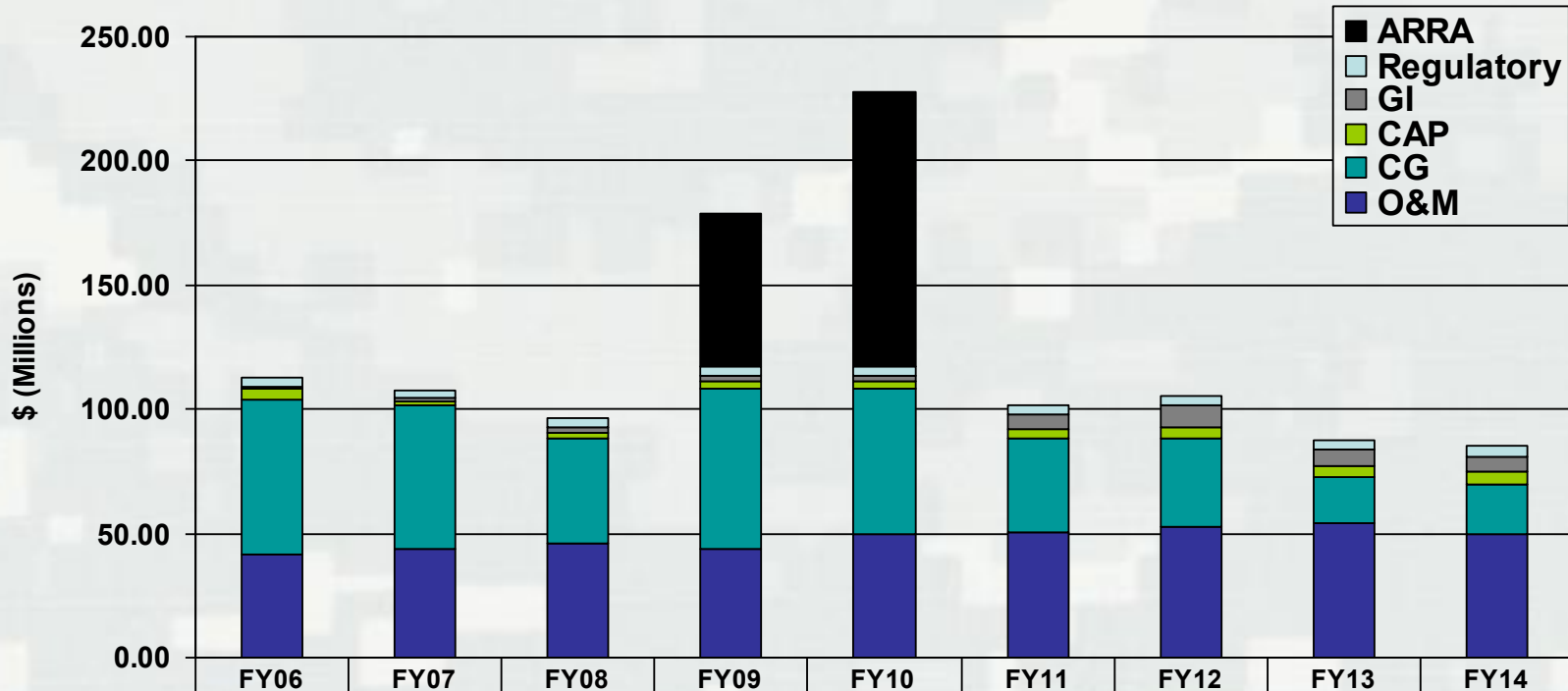
## ■ Trends

- ARRA = Significant surge in FY09 and FY10
- General Investigations (GI) & Continuing Authorities Program (CAP) budgets expected to increase with 2 new GI studies initiated in FY09 (Bed Degradation/MRAPs)
- No new starts in GI Program expected in FY10
- O&M budgets flat to slightly declining
- Construction General (CG) program declining with fluctuations based upon large project/program funding including the Missouri River Recovery Program funding
- Missouri River program interest to increase through Missouri River Ecosystem Restoration Plan (MRERP) study and the Missouri River Authorized Purposes Study (MRAPS)

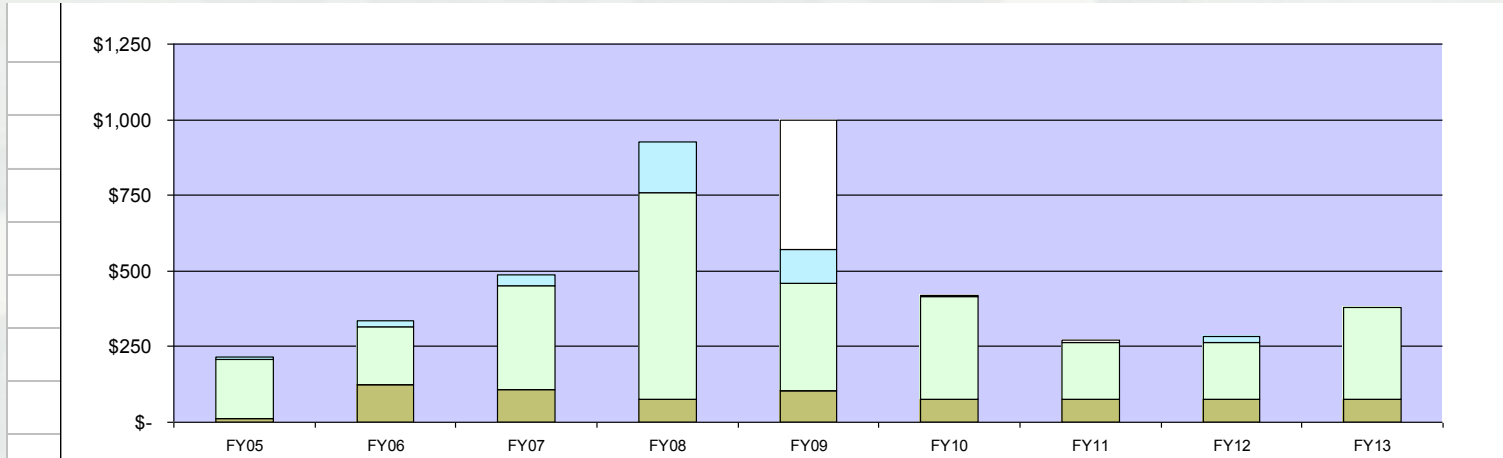

  - ▶ **Kansas Army Ammunition Plant: \$9.5M**
  - ▶ **Former Griffiss Air Force Base: \$8M**
  - ▶ **Pre-placed Remedial Action Contracts: \$820M**
  - ▶ **Environmental Quality Contracts: \$49M**
  - ▶ **Kansas Army Ammunition Plant: \$49.5M**
  - ▶ **Numerous 8a sole source contracts**
  - ▶ **Radioactive Waste Disposal: \$550M**



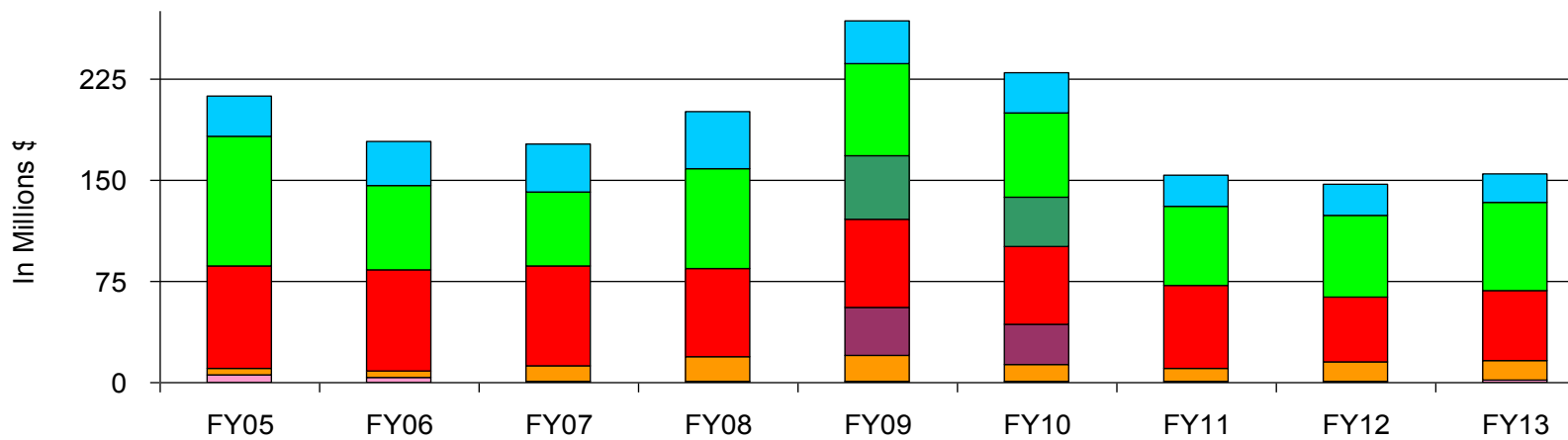
# ***Environmental Program Forecast***

## ■ Trends

- ▶ Superfund funding consistent – workload predictable
- ▶ Superfund over-extended with Remedial Actions, reduced “pipe-line” and “new start” assignments
- ▶ Superfund cost estimates and Corps execution costs receiving heavy focus by EPA
- ▶ Environmental Quality (EQ) requirements & funding unpredictable – difficult to anticipate reqd resources
- ▶ Formerly Used Defense Sites HTRW funding stable
- ▶ Formerly Used Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP) - \$90M FY10 ARRA
- ▶ FUSRAP projects moving to RA, reducing requirements for technical support

# ***Environmental Program***

## ***ARRA FY09 – FY10***

- **Superfund: \$80M for EPA Region 2**
  - ▶ \$49M in FY09 primarily to existing PRACs (ECC, Cape, Severson, Conti)
  - ▶ ~\$67M in FY10 anticipated to new PRACs (Jun 09 solicitation)
  
- **FUSRAP: \$65M for New York and St. Louis Districts**
  - ▶ \$35M in FY09 primarily to SSERC (Shaw)
  - ▶ \$30M in FY10 anticipated for existing contracts

- Total Kansas City District ARRA - \$172M
  - ▶ Construction - \$71M
  - ▶ O&M - \$101M
- Projects were reviewed and approved by HQ and OMB
- Emphasis on shovel-ready projects
  - ▶ Fund existing contracts such as Tuttle Creek and Blue River
  - ▶ Design-Build contracts may be used
  - ▶ Existing contract tools such as MATOCs and IDIQs may be used
- All standard contracting processes remain in effect
