# The New York City Water Supply: Operating, Protecting and Maintaining the World's Greatest Waterworks

Featuring Guest Speaker:

Mr. Adam Bosch

You are invited to join us for a dinner banquet with guest speaker Mr. Adam Bosch. Mr. Bosch will explain how "the largest municipal water supply in the United States, delivers, by gravity alone, 1.1 billion gallons of fresh water every day to more than 8.6 million people in New York City and another 1 million people living in 74 communities north of the City, including Newburgh and New Windsor." He will also describe and present photographs of the history of the reservoir system, and the work that NYC-DEP does to protect and maintain its drinking water every day. In addition, he will discuss the ongoing construction of the Delaware Aqueduct Bypass Tunnel which is being excavated by "a one-of-a-kind- tunnel boring machine which currently is drilling 24 hours a day under the Town of Newburgh."

Mr. Adam Bosch is Director of Public Affairs, New York City Department of Environmental Protection (NYC-DEP), Bureau of Water Supply. He was previously vice president of research and communications at Hudson Valley Pattern for Progress, a regional policy group based in Newburgh. He was a journalist in the Hudson Valley for more than a decade while working for the *Times Herald-Record, The New York Times, Wallkill Valley Times, Scientific American Magazine*, and other publications. His reporting earned five Associated Press awards for investigations, breaking news, and public service. He also taught the Investigative Reporting class at SUNY New Paltz for 10 years.
