

STV'S PLAN FOR WEST POINT LIBRARY AND LEARNING CENTER WINS FEDERAL PLANNING AWARD

EW YORK. April 14, 2003 - STV Incorporated's plan for a new library, learning center and multipurpose anothermic building at the United

States (Military
Academy (USMA) in
West Polm. N.Y., has
won the Federat
Planning Divisions
(FPD) award for Best
Area Development
Plan of 2003. The
FPD is a branch of
the American
Planning Association

(APA). The 2003 FPD Awards Program is intended to recognize recent plausing projects that demonstrate excollence in originality, transfersibility, quality, implementation and comprehensiveness. The award was presented at the APA's annual conference on March 28th.

Al West Point the construction of a new library lacking incorporating learning centers and archives was received be compared and expand the existing library notifiction, provide additional user functions, and create a facility that could meet USMA's need for training officers in an information-age army. YOUNG MEMBER COMMITTEE UPDATE


